
APPLE PIE DAYS

Biography on LTC (R) Kornacki:

LTC (R) Kornacki retired from the Armor regiment. He is a self-claimed horse enthusiast of over 30 years, with virtually everyday containing hands-on experience with horses. He has never had less than five horses on his property at any given time over the years. His is also a long-term foxhunter and has participated in numerous roles of the foxhunting at Fort Leavenworth. In keeping with horses and military posts, he has ridden the Fort Riley rimrock on many occasions, several times with a cavalryman who served with a cavalry unit at Fort Riley in the 1930s. He has also ridden a British Grand National horse, the horse being property of the British Staff College and Military Academy at Sandhurst in the United Kingdom. LTC (R) Kornacki is also the author of multiple horse-related articles in the Kansas Magazine, Covertside, The Chronicle of the Horse; and featured article in the Master of Foxhounds book, among many others. 


